EDITORIAL

Stephen Mokoka, who did not defend his South African half-marathon title three weeks ago, did so with the greatest of ease in Paarl on Saturday, at times seeming to toy with the opposition to win with a sprint on the track of the Dal Josaphat Stadium. It was the first time since the SA Track & Field Championships (including the marathon) of 1961 that a national championships of any kind was held in the Boland town.

In the women's race Irvette van Blerk claimed her third consecutive national title of the year in 33:15. Earlier in the year she had won the 10000 metres on the track and followed this with the half-marathon crown. As in latter race, Zintle Xiniwe was second, just 4 seconds behind.

Mokoka missed his personal best, run when he won the title last year in Stellenbosch, by 2 seconds; Van Blerk missed hers by 3 seconds. Xiniwe ran a PB by 10 seconds.

The first half of the race was on a gradual, although slight, incline. A group of thirteen runners soon separated from the rest, with Jeffrey Gwebu and Sibusiso Nzima, who was second in the SA Half Marathon, doing most of the front-running. The leaders completed the first kilometre in 2:55 and the second went by in 2:47. Lucky Mohale, who won the half-marathon title, joined Gwebu and Nzima at the front and they reached 3 km in 8:44 after a 3:02 split.

Soon after 4 km was reached in 11:36, Mokoka, clad in gloves and a woolen cap, surged to the front for the first time. He looked over his shoulder a few times, but no one followed and he dropped back again.

The halfway mark, shortly after the turnaround, was reached in 14:31 and then the pace picked up. Mohale and Gwebu moved ahead and this soon reduced the pack to nine. The sixth kilometre was run in 2:50 and this got rid of Boy Soke.

Mokoka shot out of the group soon after and it seemed as if he was taunting his rivals, grinning and looking back repeatedly, but only Nzima followed. Then both slowed again and the rest caught up. But the seventh kilometre had gone in 2:44 and soon the effect showed. Only six men remained at the 8 km mark, reached in 22:57: Mokoka, Nzima, Mohale, Lungisa Mdedelwa, Lindikhaya Mthangayi and Gwebu.

Mokoka surged one final time and ran the ninth kilometre in 2:48. He safely negotiated a rather rough gravel stretch between the gate of the stadium and the track and kicked away from Mdedelwa to win by 5 seconds. His final kilometre was also run in 2:48; the second half took only 13:52.

Although the standard of performances in depth was not as high as in 2009, only three men and three women in the top ten did not set PBs (Mkoka, Mthangayi and Zolani Ntongana among the men, and Van Blerk, Nolene Conrad and Tanith Maxwell among the women).

As was the case in the half marathon, the meagre prize money caused the usual visitors from Zimbabwe and other African countries to stay away. The only foreigner was Vladimir Kotov, who is a South African resident and is eligible for the national championships. He successfully defended his title in the 50-59 age group – as did Olga Howard in the same division for women, Sonja Laxton in the 60-69 category and Syvlia Tshetlanyane among the juniors.

In contrast to the days of the Nedbank sponsorship of SA road running championships, the media got short shrift. There was no invitation to the race, no accreditation, no numbers list to identify the runners. There was one improvement on last year: the driver of the media vehicle drove where the journalists asked him to, and not helter-skelter a kilomdetre in front of the leaders so that no one could see anything. And Top Events' Andrew Bell provided an excellent results service.

The straight, out-and-back route towards Wellington was fast (six list leaders were set) – and with a few minor tweaks can be made faster still. More realistic incentives will also result in quicker times next year.

The weekend's PetroSA Marathon was won by Phatlalla Mohloli (LES) in 2:18:30 and Tabitha Tsatsa (ZIM) in 2:39:54. The winners of the half marathon were Nkopane Seqhobane (LES) in 64:03 and Rutendo Nyahora (ZIM) in 78:29, while the 10 km went to Kgosi Samuel Tsosane in 29:38 and Violet Raseboya in 36:09. DRR has received no reports that the courses were short, as they were last year; results will be included next week.

Elana Meyer wrote to say that her 20th position in the Stellenbosch Totalsports 10 km (results in last week's issue) was due to the fact that, "in the true spirit of Women's Day", she pushed her daughter, Ené, in a baby jogger. Elana still holds the SA record for the distance at 31:13, set in 2001.

Three marathon greats of yesteryear, two of them Olympic champions, showed up in the results of the Falmouth Road Race, one of the most famous events in the USA. Bill Rodgers, multiple Boston Marathon champion, was 979th, Frank Shorter, Olympic champion in 1972, was far back in 3671st, and Joan Samuelson, the first female Olympic marathon champion, was 18th. South African marathon record holder Colleen de Reuck was the first American in fifth.

THE STELLENBOSCH TOTALSPORTS COURSE

Michael Meyer informed DRR that the course used for the Totalsports 10 km in Stellenbosch on 9 August was actually remeasured before the 2009 race, and provided a certificate that it is the correct distance. The course was measured and certified on 27 June 2009 by IAAF B Grade Measurer Gavin Wright. This means that the course has been the correct length for the last two years (2009 and 2010). The course used in 2008 was short, as mentioned in DRR 10:31, a fact borne out by the Race Time Bias factor of -11.65 sec/km – much more than twice the allowable limit of -5 sec/km. I am still of the opinion that courses in Stellenbosch are prone to shortening of the distance by insufficient corner taping and by athletes cutting corners and running across pavements (I have observed this myself on more than one occasion), but it is indeed good news that the Totalsports course has been certified for two years. It is now essential that the Gino's course in Stellenbosch is also checked by a competent measurer to legitimise the times run there.

NEWS

RIMMER REINSTATED FOR STOCKHOLM 800 M

Michael Rimmer, the European Championships silver medallist at 800 m, has been reinstated to second place in the 800 at the DN Galan meeting in Stockholm, part of the Samsung Diamond League. He had been disqualified by officials after the race under IAAF rule 163.6 (leaving the race course) after a protest by another runner. Rimmer was involved in some contact with other athletes between 500 and 600 and took several steps inside of the curb.

However, the jury of appeals decided that Rimmer had not gained an unfair advantage from briefly leaving the track, reports *Race Results Weekly*.

"As the stepping inside can be regarded as unintentional, and as no other runner was disturbed and no material advantage was gained, the Jury of Appeal decides, interpreting the basic purposes of IAAF Rule 163.4, to revoke Martin Rimmer's disqualification and reinstate him to the second place in the race," read a statement released by meeting director Raine Söderberg.

Rimmer clocked 1:45.11, behind winner (and European champion) Marcin Lewandowski of Poland. All other athletes were bumped down by one place.

EUROPEAN ODYSSEY

As reported in DRR No. 27, South African marathoner and DRR contributor Sharon Eldridge ran four marathons in Europe within four weeks in June, shortly after achieving her 19th medal in the Comrades in 10:41:31. On 5 June she finished 2338th in the Stockholm Marathon in 4:51:46, on 12 June she was first in the 45+ age category in the Santa Claus Marathon in Rovaniemi (FIN) in 4:59:02, on 19 June she finished 50th (8th in the 45+ category) in the Front Midnight Sun Marathon in Tromso (NOR) in 4:27:59, and on 27 June she was 74th in the ERGO White Nights Marathon in St Petersburg (RUS) in 4:58:50. A remarkable achievement by the eight-times winner of the Amatola Marathon. Here are her views on her tour. The pictures show her in St Peteresburg (top) and Tromso. - Ed.

FOUR MARATHONS ... PLUS BEER AND A REINDEER HIDE By Sharon Eldridge

We started off in Stockholm on 5 June, just five days after the Comrades Marathon, so the legs were tired and sore very early in the race. My goal was to finish all four marathons in under 5 hours, a slow time, but given the running I had already done, this would not be an



easy task. I managed to finish Stockholm in just under my target, one of 18 000 runners who completed the distance. The race was very well organised.

Next was Rovaniemi. We flew from Paris via Helsinki to Rovaniemi, where the race starts on the Arctic Circle, and Santa Claus fires the starting gun. The total number of competitors for the marathon was 70, a vast difference to the one in Sweden. The race started at 18.30 and was run in broad daylight, as

the sun does not set for two months of the year. I once again finished in under 5 hours just barely- and received a wooden medal with a picture of a reindeer on it. I won my age category and received a trophy and a reindeer hide, which I successfully managed to get through customs back in South Africa!

The following week I ran the Tromso Marathon in Norway. Tromso is the northernmost marathon in the world and was run in terrible conditions. It rained and the surrounding mountains were snow-capped.

Temperatures were between zero and 5°C. I managed to finish in under 4:30 it must have been the fear of freezing to death if I ran too slowly!!

The final race was the ERGO White Nights Marathon in St Petersburg, Russia, and by now the legs and body were showing signs of fatigue. My left knee decided to give problems 12 km from the the way, but still managed another sub-5.

Mission accomplished: Comrades Marathon followed by four international marathons! I am deeply grateful for being afforded the opportunity to travel overseas, see places of tremendous beauty and historical value, run four totally different marathons, but each special in their own way. I saw Paris from the top of the Eiffel Tower, tried the beer in all the countries, saw real live reindeer, snow, travelled through no fewer than seven countries, and had the time of my life.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

This weekly column highlights a special race or event from the past that happened in the current month.

37 years ago: 11 August 1973

Andries Krogmann set his second SA record of August when he finished second in a 10000-metre race in the Dutch town of Papendal, running 28:27.2 behind Jos Hermens (28:15.6). Earlier in the month Kroggie, as he was popularly known, had run a national record of 7:53.4 for 3000 m, also finishing second behind Hermens in Papendal. The Dutchman's time placed him ninth on the world list for the year; Krogmann was twelfth. In the longer event Krogmann's time gave him 29th spot on the world list. Four months before his visit to Europe he had won the fourth of six consecutive SA titles over 10000 m. Krogmann, born in 1951, passed away last year.
