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EDITORIAL

Olympic champion Samuel Wanjiru waited until the final 250 metres of the Bank of America Chicago Marathon to outsprint Tsegaye Kebede and defend his title in 2:06:24 – 19 seconds ahead of his Ethiopian rival. With the victory the Kenyan superstar all but secured the 2009/2010 World Marathon Majors (WMM) crown, worth \$500 000.

Like Wanjiru, Liliya Shobukhova of Russia also won the women's race for the second consecutive year with a come-from-behind effort which guaranteed her the WMM title, her first. Shobukhova clocked 2:20:25 – the fastest time in the world since Irina Mikitenko's 2:19:19 in the 2009 Berlin Marathon.

Wanjiru, who had dropped out of the Virgin London Marathon in April with a knee injury, showed the form – and racing savvy – which brought him the Olympic title in Beijing in similarly warm and sunny conditions (23 °C at the finish).



"This weather is my favorite weather," Wanjiru said afterwards. "I used my technique I used in the Olympics," he added.

Both Wanjiru and Shobukhova earned \$75 000 in prize money – the lowest of the three WMM events in the United States – and both athletes earned \$40 000 time bonuses.

Irvette van Blerk (pictured left at the finish) scored a decisive and impressive victory in the final race of the Spar Grand Prix Series in Johannesburg on Sunday, clocking 34:24. In third was René Kalmer, reversing her loss of last weekend in Cape Town to Zintle Xiniwe, who was fourth here, 30 seconds behind Kalmer. Van Blerk will represent South Africa in the World Half Marathon this weekend. "The competition will be very tough there," she said. "I want to try and run a PB and enjoy the experience. If I can improve on my best time, I'll be very happy."

Van Blerk, who won the last three races in the series, easily took the first prize in the Grand Prix, with Kalmer second and Xiniwe third.

Van Blerk pocketed R60 000. Tessa Burrell won the competition for veterans, with Olga Howard, Sonja Laxton and Nandipha Dywili taking the other categories (see standings in the News section).

In the results for the Cape Gate 10 km (DRR 10:39) Xiniwe's club was mistakenly given as Celtics. In fact she runs for Nedbank.

A new world age group record for grandmasters (60+) was set recently in Swansea by Michael Hager (GBR), who ran 33:47.

VIEWPOINT

A DEVELOPMENT MODEL FOR SA ATHLETICS

By Richard Mayer

Having been in the unusual position of working in a weak sector (the traditionally English-speaking community) of arguably the strongest athletics culture in SA, Central Gauteng Athletics, has forced me to think very hard over the years about the developmental needs of South African athletics.

Although I have always emphasised the importance of coaches and coaching structures in producing competitive athletes at all levels of the sport, with SA athletics in possibly the deepest crisis in over a hundred years of its history, simple, practical and cost effective measures are desperately needed to revitalise the sport.

What I propose assumes that there is at least one well-administered club with a committed coach or coaches in every province or major population centre, and that some youngsters will still choose athletics as their preferred sport. To put the model in a somewhat tacky formula, what is required to rebuild athletics from the ground up (the only way it can be done effectively and sustainably) is a combination of participation, inspiration and continuation.

Before you dismiss me as sounding like a motivational speaker long on "talk" and short on substance, let me explain the practical embodiment of these principles. At the outset I must state that the fundamental assumption underlying the model is that competitive athletics in South Africa will be based on a club structure for the foreseeable future and that the primary challenge facing SA athletics is get school learners to join athletics clubs where they will hopefully remain for the rest of their active lives.

The participation aspect will be an event arranged by a strong club or clubs in a particular area focussed on schools competition. In my view because of the team dimension and the excitement generated this kind of event, the best kind of event to attract schools is a relay over legs from 2 km to 4 km.

The inspiration is provided by getting a leading SA athlete of yesteryear, or better still, a star currently competing, to give out the prizes and give a motivational talk, but lastly, and in my view most importantly, the continuation consists in the organising club(s) making sure that those athletes sufficiently motivated by the event and talk to wish to engage in the sport competitively and seriously are encouraged to join the club(s) or are at least invited join coaching sessions to see whether structured and regular athletics is for them.

With 3:49 1500-metre athlete Marko Bucarizza the driving force, my club, the Lydiard Athletics Club (www.lydiardclub.org), held such an event on 9 October, with boys and girls from ten school teams competing over four legs on a 2 km loop. A crack team consisting entirely of provincial athletes from Jubulile High School in Orange Farm won the event in 25:12, but a number of promising athletes who do not belong to athletics clubs took part. Supreme competitor and superb role model, Juan van Deventer, gave a talk which provoked a flurry of questions from athletes and parents.

Van Deventer, the South African 3000-metre record holder, had the young audience gasping when he revealed the extent of the commitment required to be an international class athlete. He was quick to point out, though, that with patience and discipline many of those present could achieve similar levels of performance. Van Deventer also indicated that his long term goal was a gold medal in the 1500 m at the 2012 Olympics.

It remains to be seen how many of the clubless youngsters come to training, but I invite interested clubs and provinces to use and adapt this model to their uses. It need not, of course, be confined to middle or long distance running – one can easily think of a sprints, relays or mixed events or medley relays and/or a throws and jumps festival or a "field day".

ASA CONFIRMS MOTSOENENG BAN

Athletics South Africa (ASA) has confirmed that Comrades runner Sergio Motsoeneng has been suspended for two years from 10 August 2010. The decision was taken at the first sitting of the newly elected ASA Board.

Motsoeneng tested positive for the prohibited substance Norandrosterone, a metabolite or precursor of Nandrolone, after finishing third in this year's Comrades Marathon.

ASA endorsed the finding of the tribunal that heard Motsoeneng's case. Motsoeneng will forfeit all prize money and the gold medal he won at the Comrades Marathon. In addition he will be required to submit to doping control tests during his period of ineligibility.

The newly elected ASA Board took several decisions at its first meeting last weekend. Among these was the appointment of Hendrick Ramaala, South African record holder for the half marathon, as assistant to interim administrator Ray Mali to help with the day-to-day running of the ASA office.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

This weekly column highlights a special race or event from the past that happened in the current month.

30 years ago: 4 October 1980

Matthews Motshwarateu, a first-year student at UTEP (University of Texas at El Paso), won the inaugural TAC Grand Prix Series race in Purchase, New York, in a new world best of 28:00 (actually 27:59.3). The South African won \$10 000 which, under the rules then in force at the dawn of the professional era, was not given directly to him but sent to his club. The prize money was called "reimbursement for expenses". Briton Nick Rose, who was second, said Motshwarateu's time was worth 27:20 on the track (his SA record stood at 27:48.2). Bill Rodgers, who was to run a marathon in Toronto the next day, finished seventh. Motshwarateu's time is still the SA record.
