# **GEBRSELASSIE WILL CONTINUE RUNNING**

As was widely expected, marathon world record holder Haile Gebrselassie has announced his unretirement. After abruptly announcing his retirement after dropping out of the ING New York City Marathon last Sunday, Gebrselassie has decided to continue his running career after all, according to his long-time management firm, Global Sports Communications (GSC).

Race Results Weekly reports that, according to GSC officials, Gebrselassie was "overloaded with heartwarming reactions from all over the world" when he returned home to Ethiopia. They said he underestimated the impact his retirement would have on the Ethiopian public and his fans everywhere, and that he now planned to continue his career through the 2012 Olympics. Gebrselassie, 37, said that during his four and one-half minute

press conference in New York, where he withdrew from the race with knee pain after the 25 km mark, he was overcome with emotion and wasn't thinking clearly.

"I trained so hard for this and I was so focused to be successful in New York," the two-time Olympic 10000 m gold medallist said in a statement. "After the race I was tired, I was in pain and I was disappointed that all my hard work didn't bring me the result I was hoping for. I was very emotional."

Gebrselassie's announcement is good news for the organisers of the Tokyo Marathon next February. Prior to his unsuccessful run in New York, race organisers had announced that Gebrselassie would headline their race on 27 February, just days before the athlete announced his retirement. Presumably, he will start there now.

## YELLOW PAGES CASH FOR SUB-4 MILES

South Africa's middle distance runners will be able to cash in during December – provided they can run faster than 4 minutes for the mile. A four-minute mile is a rare event in South Africa these days, and Yellow Pages has decided to do something about it by placing the focus on this distance at the four Yellow Pages Summer Series meetings at the coast in the last month of the year.

The meetings will be held at Coetzenburg (Friday, 10 December), in Oudtshoorn (13 December), Port Elizabeth (15 December) and Parow (18 December).

The first athlete to clock a time faster than 4 minutes during the series will collect R5 000, with athletes thereafter running faster than 4 minutes collecting R1 000 each.

The last athlete to run a sub-4 minute mile in South Africa was Johan Cronje (3:58.81 in Parow on 16 December 2005), while the fastest time this year stands behind the name of Windy Jonas (4:02.88), clocked in Port Elizabeth during the opening event of the Yellow Pages Series on 19 February this year.

## **STATS TIME**

#### THE ATHENS CLASSIC MARATHON

This year marks the 2500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Battle of Marathon on 12 September, 490 BC - the event that spurred the birth of the marathon footrace in 1896. In the 2010 edition of the NWU Puk SA Athletics Anual I wrote an article about the origin of the classic race as we know it today. Here I would like to share with DRR readers some interesting facts about the Athens Classic Marathon, which is run on the same course from Marathon to Athens used for the 1896



and 2004 Olympic marathons (although it is probably not the route followed by the legendary messenger Pheidippides in 490 BC).

The first Athens Marathon was held in 1955, and thereafter it was run every second year until 1967 when it became an annual event. Before 1955, however, other marathons were held on the course, such as the 1906 Intercalated Games Marathon and seven editions of the Balkan Games Championships.

Although men such as Abebe Bikila and Buddy Edelen won the race between 1955 and 1968, the marathon really attracted international attention only in 1969 when Bill Adcocks (GBR) ran his brilliant time of 2:11:07.2. Over the next thirty-odd years some of the world's best marathoners – Ian Thompson, Rodolfo Gomez, Gerard Nijboer, Douglas Wakiihuri and Abel Anton among them – would win the race, but Adcocks' record stood untouched.

It was only with the return of the Olympics to Athens in 2004 that Stefano Baldini (ITA) succeeded in finally wiping the record from the books when he clocked 2:10:55 to win the gold medal.

Two South Africans have won the race. On 14 October 1984 Leon Swanepoel was the victor in 2:28:53 and on 11 October 1987 Kevin Flanegan was first across the line in the Panathenaikon Stadium in 2:25:14. Swanepoel, better known as an ultramarathon runner, was ninth in the Standard Bank 100 km Ultramarathon Challenge in Stellenbosch in 1989 when Bruce Fordyce broke the world record. Flanegan, with a PB of 2:15:06 for the marathon, was the SA champion in 1983.

# 20 years ago: 4 November 1990

Douglas Wakiihuri (KEN) won the 21st edition of the New York City Marathon over Salvador Garcia (MEX), 2:12:39 to 2:13:19. Welshman Stephen Brace finished third in 2:13:32. In the women's race Wanda Panfil (POL) beat Kim Jones (USA) by 5 seconds in 2:30:45. Katrin Dörre (GER) was third in 2:33:21 while 9-time winner Grete Waitz (NOR) was fourth (2:34:34). Waitz finished the race a total of elven times (and had one dnf). The next year in Tokyo Panfil would also take the world title, with Dörre claiming the bronze medal.
