EDITORIAL

Zola Pieterse, former double world cross-country champion and veteran list leader in the half marathon, finished second in the Mineshaft Half Marathon in Queensburgh this weekend. Pieterse, on a visit from her home in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, clocked 94:37 to win her age category. (Despite its name, this race is not downhill but a two-lapper, with a huge hill that has to be climbed twice.)

Also in KwaZulu-Natal, one of South Africa's oldest ultramarathons, the Arthur Creswell Memorial over 52 km, was held for the 46th time. This race *is* point to point and downhill. Kerry Koen dipped under 4 hours to win the women's event.

Unfortunately no results of the SA U.23, Junior and Youth Championships in Germiston were available. Next weekend the senior championships take place; hopefully those results will be available in time for publication.

Internationally, a world list leader was set by Micah Kogo (KEN) when he won the Parelloop 10 km on the super-fast course in Brunssum in 27:15.

In last week's results of the Nongoma Ultramarathon the first women was Margaret Mahohoma (not Mabopane) of Zimbabwe.

Because I am going away for a few days holiday on Wednesday, next week's DRR will be a bit later than usual.

PETITION ASKS FOR CHUENE'S RETURN

In what could have been mistaken for an April Fool's joke if it had been published on 1 April, The Star reported on 30 March that a petition addressed to the Speaker of Parliament is asking for the immediate reinstatement of disgraced former president of Athletics South Africa Leonard Chuene.

One can only marvel at the audacity of people who are behind a move to bring back someone who brought the sport into disprepute, enriching himself and his cronies in the process, and who exploited his position to manage athletics as if it was his own personal empire.

The newspaper reported that "axed ASA members and other sports administrators" are asking Parliament to nullify the suspensions of Chuene, his board and other office-bearers. They also want the legislature to investigate the processes followed in suspending [the office-bearers] and to set up an investigation into the activities of SASCOC."

The petition was signed by 47 "concerned athletes"; it also asks for the Minister of Sport "to intervene in the 'fracas involving ASA and SASCOC for the sake of sport". The petition

alleges that the Olympic body had been targeting ASA for years and used "the Semenya debacle" to remove Chuene.

"[The petitioners] say that when SASCOC found no wrongdoing in the Semenya matter, it extended the mandate of its investigation into other issues", according to the report, which also said that the campaign is led by Michael Mbambani of the Mr Price Athletics Club in Port Elizabeth.

The petition also stated that there was an improper relationship between SASCOC and the lottery distribution fund, as the majority of members of the latter are also either SASCOC members or "people directly connected to SASCOC".

RECORD FIELD FOR TWO OCEANS

A record field of close to 23 000 runners are expected to line up for the Old Mutual Two Oceans Marathon on Easter Saturday. The half marathon has attracted the biggest field in the event's history, with just over 14 000 participants lining up (half of them are women). The ultra marathon has attracted just under 9 000 runners.

"The half marathon is the biggest in the country and broke all entry records when we had to close entries in early January, two months ahead of the planned cut-off date. We received 2 000 entries in 36 hours before we closed entries," said Rowyn James, race director.

The trail run has also broken records in terms of entries as all 800 entries were received in under 24 hours. This is the second year the trail run is being held and it is becoming a "must do" event on the calendar.

James added that while the ultra remains the flagship event with all the history behind it, the half marathon and trail runs are definitely where the growth is in terms of women's and novice running, and participants looking for something different to do.

Among the interesting statistics extracted from the entries are the following:

- Eight of last year's top ten men in the 56 km have re-entered. In the women's race seven of the top ten have re-entered. The Nurgalieva twins have confirmed their entries, while the men's defending champion from Lesotho, Mabuthile Lebopo, will be lining up on race day. The increased prize money in the ultra seems to have attracted great interest from top runners, with a large contingent of Ethiopian runners coming to participate.
- Six of last year's top ten men in the half marathon have re-entered and Lusapho April will be back to defend his title. In the women's race, five of last year's top ten have entered, including winner and course record holder René Kalmer. Other names to watch are Helalia Johannes and Irvette van Blerk.
- A total of 1 269 runners, or 5.6% of the total field, will be coming from outside the borders of South Africa, with 77 different countries represented. Among these are 459 participants from the United Kingdom, 275 from Germany and 184 from the USA.
- A total of 69 runners will receive their light blue number for completing 10 half marathons, while 123 runners participating in the shorter race have their light blue number already.
- A total of 208 runners will get their blue number for completing ten ultras; 1 004 runners in the ultra have their blue number already.
- In the ultra field 35% will be doing the race for the first time.
- More than 82% of the runners entered online.
- A total of 38 runners in the half marathon and 42 in the ultra will celebrate their birthday on race day.

WANJIRU OUT OF LONDON MARATHON

Samuel Wanjiru's woes -- which recently included an arrest for threatening his wife and possessing an illegal weapon, and a car accident -- now include the loss of his spring

marathon, reports *Race Results Weekkly*. The reigning Olympic and World Marathon Majors champion has been forced to withdraw from the Virgin London Marathon with a knee injury.

"I am bitterly disappointed not to be able to race in London this year," Wanjiru, 24, said through a news release. "Winning the London Marathon in 2009 was one of the great achievements of my career and I was hoping to become the London champion again." He continued: "But I have been suffering some problems with my right knee recently which meant I had to withdraw from the Lisbon Half Marathon. Unfortunately, it has not responded well enough for me to make my final preparations for London."

After winning last October's Bank of America Chicago Marathon in a thrilling sprint finish over Ethiopian Tesgaye Kebede, Wanjiru has faced several difficulties. Last December, he was arrested at his home in Nyahururu and charged with threatening his wife, striking a security guard, and possessing an illegal AK-47 rifle. Wanjiru was released on bail, and his wife later withdrew her charges against him (he still faces the weapons charge, however). Wanjiru was also involved in a car accident last January on the Nairobi-Nyahururu road, rolling his four-wheel-drive vehicle several times trying to avoid an oncoming truck.

Acting quickly, London race director Dave Bedford has added three-time London champion Martin Lel to the field (both athletes are represented by Federico Rosa). Lel, 32, who has a 2:05:15 personal best, won the London race in 2005, 2007 and 2008. Struggling with his own injury problems, Lel hasn't run a marathon since finishing fourth at the Olympic Games in 2008. He has, however, completed several half marathons, winning both the 2009 Lisbon and Great North races and breaking one hour in both events. The 31st edition of the Virgin London Marathon will be held on 17 April.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

This weekly column highlights a special race or event from the past that happened in the current month.

72 years ago: 8 April 1939

In the 1930s the South African marathoning scene was highlighted by the rivalry between Johannes Lodewyk Meyer Coleman and Henry Alfred Gibson – more generally known as Johnny Coleman and Jackie Gibson. Both were selected for the 1938 Empire Games in Sydney, where Coleman ran a brilliant race to win in 2:30:49.8 and Gibson took the bronze medal. But on this day in Krugersdorp Gibson soundly defeated Coleman for the SA

title, winning in 2:35:07, with Arthur Hampton second and Coleman third in 2:45:53. That was Gibson's third and last national title – the next year, in the final race between the two, Coleman turned the tables. Gibson lost his life in an aircraft crash near Durban in 1944 after serving with the SA Air Force in World War II.
