EDITORIAL

SA marathon champion Cornelia Joubert scored her first international marathon win this weekend when she smashed her personal best with a time of 2:39:37 in the Orange International Marathon in Mauritius. Joubert has run only one previous marathon – when she took the national title earlier this year in 2:46:13. She has now improved by almost seven minutes to move into 18th place on the SA all-time list.

Mpho Mabuza was third in 2:48:22, while Anthony Godongwana took the same position in the men's race in 2:20:55. Incidentally, the first three men are all called Anthony!


SA 1500- and 5000-metre champion scored a huge personal best in yesterday's Spar Grand Prix 10 km in Durban, running a list leader of 32:49 to beat Rutendo Nyahora (ZIM) by a whopping margin of more than a minute. Nyahora won the first two Spar races, in Cape Town and Port Elizabeth, but here she had no answer to Makhanya's speed. Makhanya's previous PB of 33:23 came in the Cape Town race. She said her focus is still mainly on track running, but she certainly can improve considerably on the road.

René Kalmer, in her first race since sustaining an injury in the Boston Marathon, finished fourth, one place behind sister Christine. Myrette Filmalter also scored a PB in sixth with her 35:01, while marathoner Irvette van Zyl was eleventh.

The weekend's other list leader also came from a woman when 17-year-old Annie Bothma won the Eersterivier 15 km by more than 5 minutes in 56:41.

No confirmation has been received from Athletics South Africa, but *Distance Running Results* learned today that the SA Half-marathon Championships, scheduled for Witbank on 20 July, have been cancelled. No reason for this unfortunate decision is known.

At the US Track & Field Championships in Des Moines Bernard Lagat won his sixth 5000 m title in the slowest time in 61 years (14:54.16 – the women's race was won in 15:33.77!). Lagat ran the final mile in approximately 3:55; he and Galen Rupp clinched world team

berths. In the 10000 m Olympic silver medallist Rupp won his fifth straight title in a slow, tactical race which was broken up by his training partner, Dathan Ritzenhein. In the women's 800 m Alvsia Montano (1:58.67) won her fifth national title, leading from gun to tape. Brenda Martinez held back, and closed hard to nearly catch Montano, while junior Ajee' Wilson set a big PB to get third (1:59.55, her first sub-2:00 performance). Both Martinez and Wilson made their first World Championships team. In the 1500 m Mary Cain shot to the lead at the bell, and nearly ran away with the race. She was caught by training partner Treniere Moser inside of the final 20 meters and Moser (4:28.62) won her fourth USA 1500 title in the slowest time of these championships since 1968. Cain (4:28.76) became the youngest-ever athlete to make a USA national team for a World Championships.

Distance Running Results received the results of the Interprovincial Cross-country meeting in

Rustenburg on 8 June, but the distances were so far short of the advertised distances (evident from the times recorded) that it was decided not to publish the results. The first three men in the "8 km" were Albert Ntsoane (province unknown), Sampie Moksatla (AVT) and Edward Setshedi (AGN); the first three women in the "4 km" were Leilani Scheffer (NWN), Liza Maritz (AGN) and Anita O'Brien (NWN).



ASA FIGHTS BACK DESPITE SASCOC SUSPENSION

One day before the SA Sports Confederation and Olympic Committee (SASCOC) suspended the membership of Athletics South Africa (ASA) yesterday, ASA members decided at a special meeting that an independent commission of enquiry would be appointed to investigate the actions of the suspended Board members.

These are the latest developments in the ongoing struggle for control of the sport. The ASA members (13 of the provincial and associate members attended the meeting) decided to reinstate the elected board and also that members should be free to resolve the body's problems internally, without outside interference.

In the meantime the IAAF has expressed its support for ASA President James Evans and the elected board. The commission of enquiry would also look into the still unproven allegations against Evans which led to the current situation.

In a circular to provinces SASCOC claims that ASA has contravened Clause 9.3 of its Articles of Association, i.e. that it may suspend any national federation that "engages in any misconduct, improper practices, misdemeanor, acts of defiance, or brings SASCOC into disrepute".

The letter, signed by CEO Tubby Reddy, states that SASCOC has done its "utmost best to restore order and sanity during the debacles" at ASA. SASCOC slams the IAAF because it "hampered" SASCOC's efforts, according to the letter.

Reddy states that SASCOC has approached the international body verbally, in writing and "via a meeting", but that the IAAF "does not recognise SASCOC as a sports authority in South Africa. The IAAF would rather support ASA, which has no leadership."

SASCOC warns that athletes will not be included in future teams to the Commonwealth Games, All Africa Games, Olympic Games, etc., as long as the suspension is in effect, and that SASCOC will give no further financial assistance to athletes.

Athletics can reapply for membership of SASCOC when ASA has "a duly democratically elected President and leadership".

MULAUDZI RETIRES

South Africa's top 800 m runner of recent years, Mbulaeni Mulaudzi, has announced his retirement and will be taking a job in construction and building development. He ran sub-1:45 for ten consecutive seasons, 2001-10, with a best of 1:42.89 in 2003. Highlights of a very distinguished career were a Commonwealth gold medal in 2002, World Indoor gold and Olympic silver in 2004 and winning the world title in 2009 after making the final in

2001, 2003 and 2007. He also won a World Indoor silver in 2006 and 2008. Mulaudzi was South Africa's Athlete of the Year in 2006 and 2009.

ZOLA AND NEWTON STEER KAROO ULTRA

Zola Pieterse, former double world cross-country champion, and her company Newton Running will be involved with one of South Africa's most venerable races, the Newton Karoo Marathon, this year. The race, together



with a half marathon, 10 km and 5 km, will be held in Laingsburg on 21 September. It will be the 43rd running of the ultramarathon over 80 km.

Pieterse will be in action in the half marathon. She was entered for the recent Comrades Marathon, but withdrew shortly before the race because of flu.

Led by Choppie, die Karoo Dorper sheep mascot of Laingsburg Tourism, the town offers a week of festivities which will culminate in the ultramarathon. These include the Karoo Lamb Carcass competition and a braai on the Friday, the Miss Laingsburg beauty pageant, and another braai with the prize-giving function for the road races on the Saturday evening. All the athletes in the ultramarathon will receive a delicious free plate of Karoo lamb "braaivleis" with all the trimmings at the function.

The first Karoo ultramarathon, which is run partly on tar and partly on gravel, was held in 1971. Over the years a number of South Africa's best ultradistance runners have won the race – among them Gordon Baker, Graham Fraser, Leon Swanepoel, Deon Holzhausen, Siphiwe Ggele and Johan Oosthuizen.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

60 years ago: 13 June 1953

In the same way that 6 May 1954 will forever be associated with miling, so this date is the marathon's day, and it is the day when Jim Peters redeemed himself after dropping out of the previous year's Olympic Marathon (during which, it is said, eventual champion Emil Zatopek had asked Peters: "I know virtually nothing about marathon running, but don't you think we ought to go a little faster?"). Shortly after setting a personal best for 6 miles, Peters tackled the Polytechnic Marathon from Windsor to Chiswick and won by almost 8 minutes in 2:18:40.4 – the first bona fide sub-2:20 marathon in history. On a point-to-

point course that was actually 156 yards longer than 26 miles 385 yards, Peters ran 5-mile splits of 27:05, 25:35, 25:40 and 26:47 to 20 miles, followed by 33:33 for the last 6¼ miles. Just three months later he won the Enschede Marathon in 2:19:22, a new world best on an out-and-back course.
