EDITORIAL

I was shocked yesterday to receive the news of the serious injuries sustained by Sonja Laxton (pictured) in a hit-andrun accident in Rosebank, Johannesburg. According to SAPA, Laxton, one of the best athletes ever produced in South Africa and the first to receive Springbok colours in all three disciplines of athletics, was struck by a car while on a training run and was taken to the Milpark Hospital, where she is being treated for multiple injuries, including broken elbows and shoulders, fractured ribs, as well as a fractured ankle and spine. She will need extensive surgery to repair the broken joints. Details of the incident are still sketchy, but the driver of the vehicle that hit Sonja, who is a DRR subscriber, was apprehended later. On behalf of all DRR readers I would like to extend our heartfelt good wishes to her and, with husband Ian and daughter Kim, hope for a

full recovery of this extraordinary athlete and role model of South African sport.

The day before the accident Kim had run the second fastest half marathon of her career when she won the Winelands Half Marathon in ideal conditions in Stellenbosch in 1:19:15, beating the second runner by more than 8 minutes. The men's race went to Lindikhaya Mthangayi (1:07:54), while the 36th running of the marathon was won by Dicardo Jakobs (2:26:10) and Candyce Hall (3:03:44).

In the Yokohama Marathon René Kalmer finished sixth in 2:32:39, her third fastest time ever. She ran her personal best of 2:29:59 when she finished fifth in Yokohama two years ago.

DRR reported two weeks ago on the election of the new Comrades Board. Since then Macdonald Chitja has been elected as Chairman. Chitja, who has completed the race fifteen times, has been associated with the Comrades since 2001, when he was elected onto the Executive Committee. Peter Proctor was elected as the Vice-chairman, while Neville Thomas was co-opted for his skills in financial administration.

In the results of the HFPA Half Marathon in last week's DRR the second and third master were in the wrong order. Chris Mitchell was second in 1:22:25 and Steven Parkins third in 1:24:19.

CORRECTION

SAM TSHABALALA

The Comrades Marathon Association (CMA) has informed *Distance Running Results* that Sam Tshabalala, the first black man to win the Comrades Marathon in 1989, has in fact not passed away, as published in last week's DRR. The CMA had sent out the original media release with the news, which was quickly distributed further in social media, and has apologised for the unfortunate error in an e-mail to DRR (although it did not issue a public correction or apology). It said that it had confirmed with Tshabalala's friend and fellow runner Louis Harmse that he was in fact "alive and well".



HIGH SCHOOL STAR MARY CAIN TURNS PRO AT 17

After a record-smashing year which culminated in a 10th place finish at the IAAF World Championships 1500 m, US high school middle distance standout Mary Cain has decided to become a professional athlete at the age of 17. She will continue to be coached by Alberto Salazar and will now be represented by Ricky Simms of PACE Sports Management, reports Race Results Weekly.

"For the past couple of months, my family and I have been debating whether I should compete at a collegiate or professional level going forward," Cain said through a statement circulated to the media. "I have decided, and am truly

excited to announce, that I will be turning pro. I believe that, in the long run, this is the best way for me continue to develop as an athlete."

Cain enjoyed a magical season in 2013 where she excited crowds on both coasts with her record runs. She set USA junior records at 800 m (1:59.51; later surpassed by Ajee' Wilson's 1:58.21), 1500 m (4:04.62), indoor 1500 m and mile (4:11.72/4:28.25), and indoor 3000 m and 2 miles (9:04.51/9:38.68). She won the USA indoor mile title in Albuquerque in March and finished second in the 1500 m in the USA Outdoor Championships in June to earn her place on the World Championships team for Moscow. At 17 years old, she was the youngest-ever athlete to compete in a World Championships 1500 m final.

Simms said that Cain will finish high school as scheduled in the spring of 2014; no plans for college were revealed, except that she planned to continue her education. Her parents, Charlie and Mary, said that they fully supported their daughter's decision to turn pro.

"How to proceed was always going to be a difficult choice," said her father through a statement. "Mary is a straight-A student and will be pursuing a college education while competing. This remains a priority and we think this approach is the best way to balance her educational and athletic goals."

PACE Sports Management represents other important athletes who are coached by Alberto Salazar, including double Olympic Champion Mo Farah, Olympic silver medalist Galen Rupp, and 2009 World Championships 1500 m bronze medalist Shannon Rowbury.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

61 years ago: 30 November 1952

Fred Wilt won the US Cross-country Championships over 10 km in Buffalo, New York, in 32:31, beating Horace Ashenfelter by one second to get the second of his three titles. Wilt, who would later become a famous author of athletics training books, never won an Olympic title, but Ashenfelter had won the Olympic steeplechase crown four months before in world record time of 8:45.4. The US national title race has now been run 115 times and is the tenth oldest championship race of any kind in the world.
