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EDITORIAL

Before the World Championships in Beijing it had seemed unlikely that Justin Gatlin would be beaten in the 100 m – and even less likely that the fabulous Ethiopian Genzebe Dibaba would not win the 5000 m. And yet both lost; Dibaba, who recently set a world record for 1500 m, by a shockingly wide margin – in fact, she was "only" third.

Thus she was denied the double, although she did win the 1500 m by a narrow margin in 4:08.09. Briton Mo Farah was spectacularly successful in his quest for a double, taking both the 10000 m and the 5000 m on the last day with his searing kick at the end. Farah has now won the double at the last three global championships, beginning with the Olympic Games in 2012. In the 5000 the pack jogged along for the first nine circuits, running laps as slow as 73 sec. With two laps to go, Caleb Ndiku sprinted away and covered the penultimate lap in a blistering 58.4, followed by 54.3. But even this was not enough, for the defending champion clocked 52.7 for the last lap. His winning time of 13:50.38 is the slowest in the history of the Championships.

Asbel Kiprop's win in the 1500 m means that he joined two of the sports all-time greats, Hicham El Guerrouj of Morocco and Noureddine Morceli of Algeria, as the third man ever to win three or more world 1500 m titles (El Guerrouj has four).

"I knew that when it comes to the last 200, 250 metres, remember, that's how [Taoufik] Makhloifi won the Olympics in London," said Kiprop, who finished a disappointing 12th in that race. He continued: "When you compare his last 50 metres, he's not moving. I was a

little bit confident that maybe that's where I could win." And that's how it happened. In the final 50 m Makhloufi was tying up, Kiprop's teammate Elijah Manangoi and Morocco's Abdalaati Iguider were also kicking hard, and the tall, lanky Kenyan hit top speed. Makhloufi had been beaten, and Kiprop's other rivals simply couldn't match his tempo. He won in 3:34.40 ahead of Manangoi (3:34.63) and Iguider (3:34.67) who practically threw himself over the line. Makhloufi finished fourth.

South Africa's Johan Cronje, third in Moscow, could not make the final; his 3:36.59 is the fastest ever non-qualifying time. (He ran 3:36.83 when he won his bronze medal.)

In the women's 800 m, Marina Arzamasova of Belarus won her nation's first ever medal in this event at the World Championships, winning a surprisingly tactical contest over Canada's Melissa Bishop and Kenya's Eunice Sum. "Of course I expected the podium," said Arzamasova, who clocked 1:58.03. "After the semi-finals, I expected gold medal."

In the same event for men, world record holder David Rudisha delivered a commanding performance. He went out slow, controlled the race, then finished fast (51.67 second lap) to win his third world title.

Ethiopia's Mare Dibaba (no relation to multiple gold medallist Tirunesh Dibaba or her younger sister Genzebe) won the first-ever marathon gold medal by an

Ethiopian woman at the Championships. Not even 1.5 m tall, the tiny Dibaba stormed into the stadium with her taller Kenyan rival Helah Kiprop, outkicking her for gold, 2:27:35 to 2:27:36 in the closest finish ever in the history of the Championships. Bronze went to Eunice Kirwa, a Kenyan-born athlete who switched her allegiance to Bahrain back in 2010.

Dibaba, whose coach Haji Adillo told *Race Results Weekly* two days before the race that she was in the best shape of her life, took a patient approach from the start of the race. Running with her Ethiopian teammates, Tigist Tufa and Tirfi Tsegaye, she was content to cruise along at the gentle early pace, set mostly by the Japanese team of Mai Ito, Risa Shigetomo and Sairi Maeda. The entire Kenyan team, led by defending champion Edna Kiplagat and last year's TCS New York City Marathon runner-up Jemima Sumgong, was also in the lead pack which cruised through halfway in a modest 1:15:16. The soaking humidity made running any faster difficult.

By 30 km (1:46:50), the Japanese team was struggling to keep up. Like they had done in the 5000 m and 10000 m, they set the pace early, but then faded when the faster running started. The five kilometers between 30 and 35 km were the fastest so far in the race (17:15), putting the Japanese out of contention. That segment was fast enough to dwindle the pack to just six: Dibaba, Sumgong, Kirwa, Kiprop, Kiplagat and Tufa. Just three minutes later, Tufa was dropped. Kiplagat, who is typically comfortable running at the back of the pack, was staying in contact, but soon she too started to fade.

The 5 km segment through the 40 km mark was covered in a swift 16:34, easily the fastest of the race. The four women left – Dibaba, Kiprop, Kirwa, and Sumgong – were all still in contention as National Stadium came into view. "When we were at 40 kilometers it was a

bit tricky," observed Kiprop, who was competing in her first World Championships. "Everybody was there. Everybody was strong."

All four women entered the tunnel to the stadium at about the same time, but Sumgong was lagging. Into the arena, Dibaba and Kiprop emerged from behind the electronic sign at the top of the homestretch together. Like the men last weekend, they only had 110 m to run in the stadium: a straight drag race for the tape.

"When I saw the Ethiopian athlete pushing, then I tried to push," Kiprop told reporters. "I didn't expect, but I tried my best."

"I had a very strong strategy to (out)kick everybody," Dibaba told the media after the race, adding that she used the four Kenyans in the race to set the pace for her. "My plan was to follow them, head-by-head. When we were coming [into the stadium], the two of us on the track, I wanted to use all my energy to the final line," Dibaba told *Race Results Weekly* with coach Adillo translating. "I know I'm very fast kick in the last. I don't worry about anything." The final 2.195 km of the race (6:57) was the fastest ever in the World Championships.

South Africa's Tanith Maxwell did not finish and stopped at 18 km due to a painful neck and shoulder.

With her victory Dibaba is now on top of the Abbott World Marathon Majors leaderboard for Series IX with 41 points. Kiprop is second with 32 points. The series concludes at the Tokyo Marathon next February when the top male and female point-earners will be awarded a \$500 000 grand prize.

In the women's 5000 Almaz Ayana produced a brilliant championship record performance, running away from Dibaba and clocking a sizzling 14:26.83. Dibaba, who ran in second place most of the race, could not defend her position in the final drive to the line, and was outsprinted by her teammate Senbere Teferi, 14:44.07 to 14:44.14. The victory margin of 17.24 sec is by far the biggest in history at the meeting. Amazingly, Ayana might have gotten close to the world record (14:11.15) had the first five full laps not been run in the 72 to 73 second range as they were. So fast were her final kilometers that she ran the last 3000 m in 8:19.91, faster than every non-Chinese mark on the all-time list. The Ethiopian sweep of the medals was the first since their compatriots Tirunesh Dibaba, Meseret Defar and Ejagayou Dibaba finished 1-2-3 in Helsinki in 2005.

In the women's 10000 m Vivian Cheruiyot regained the title she first won in 2011 (she missed 2013 on maternity leave), winning in a sprint finish over Gelete Burka. Emily Infeld passed USA teammate Molly Huddle right at the finish line when Huddle celebrated prematurely. The USA, with 3rd, 4th and 6th place finishes, had its best-ever World Championships team placing.

KENYA'S SUCCESS: IT'S MORE THAN THE RIFT VALLEY

It appeared to be business as usual for Kenya at the World Championships last Monday night.

Vivian Cheruiyot won another women's distance title, her second in the 10000 m. Ezekiel Kemboi then led another Kenyan medal sweep in the men's 3000 m steeplechase and, as usual, still had the energy to dance on the track after his latest devastating kick.

"I will be celebrating tonight with my teammates," Kemboi said.

So it has gone for decades, and the sports world is generally quite comfortable with the received wisdom that Kenyan success derives from the natural advantages conferred by the Great Rift Valley's altitude and the motivation that comes from living in a society in which running is one of the few pathways to international fame and fortune.

But Kenyans have clearly been relying on some unnatural advantages as well. The received wisdom is looking more than a little naïve with over 30 Kenyan athletes having tested positive for banned substances since 2012. That includes Rita

Jeptoo, a three-time Boston Marathon champion, who was barred for two years after testing positive in an out-of-competition test last year for the banned blood booster EPO.

Jeptoo has since appealed to the Court of Arbitration for Sport against the suspension while the IAAF, the sport's world governing body, has appealed to the same court to have Jeptoo's penalty increased to a four-year ban.

This year, there have been more allegations of widespread doping in Kenya, and elsewhere. A recent report by the German television station ARD and *The Sunday Times* concluded that from 2001 to 2012 more than 100 Olympic and world championship medalists in distance events had suspicious blood test results. Those included 18 as yet unidentified Kenyans.

The IAAF has said that the reported results — leaked from a confidential IAAF database — are not sufficient proof of doping and were collected in large part before the introduction of the biological passport, which tracks athletes' blood values over their career.

But there is clearly a significant issue in Kenya, and significant room for improvement, which needs to be nearly as speedy as Kemboi's last lap.

Longtime pillars of the track community, such as Kemboi's former coach Moses Kiptanui, are continuing to speak out. Kiptanui, a three-time world steeplechase champion, is stepping away from coaching altogether because of his frustration with the situation.

"The problem is that the number of athletes is huge now," Kiptanui told France's *L'Équipe* magazine in an article published last week. "Now, only the very best of them have the chance to go abroad to run and thus make money. It's why they are ready to do anything to make their mark, in particular doping."

Moni Wekesa, a Kenyan professor who was the head of an independent task force in Kenya that recently investigated the severity of the problem, agreed that banned substances were far too easy to procure.

"In this country, there is more EPO being consumed by athletes than by the ill," he told *L'Équipe*. "In Kenya, we thought that doping only concerned people who lived in France and in England. But our investigation has shown us how enormous the problem is here. There's lots of ignorance. Lots of the young athletes who are using these products lack education. And the government did absolutely nothing to stop this, no policy of prevention."

Kenyan track and field officials have called the ARD and *Sunday Times* reports "an attempt to smear our runners" and destabilize the team before Beijing.

But the scandals and allegations have reportedly taken a toll on national pride and interest in runners' achievements, even if Uhuru Kenyatta, Kenya's president, was quick to send his congratulations to Kemboi and Cheruiyot on Twitter.

Positive tests — particularly positive out-of-competition tests — are, of course, also a sign of progress and oversight. It is ever clearer that a global sport like track and field is only as credible as the weakest link in its antidoping chain: be it in Kenya, Russia, the Caribbean or anywhere else that could produce a leading athlete.

"The shame is the lack of a super strong system hurts the clean athletes in every way," said Mary Wittenberg, the former chief executive of New York Road Runners, which organizes the New York City Marathon. "Some will lose and some will win but under a cloud of suspicion. I think the new race will come from the athletes. Rather than a race for a pill, they'd like a race for a test that can prove they are clean."

Wekesa, the Kenyan professor, and others maintain that the influx of foreign agents has played a role in the rise of doping. It can also be difficult to locate runners in the Great Rift Valley for unannounced testing when some areas do not have official addresses.

Local knowledge and integrity are key. And another key will be getting a reliable testing center in Kenya.

"It's a real concern," Wittenberg said. "The World Marathon Majors was strongly supportive of an out-of-competition testing lab and system in Kenya and Ethiopia. That has to happen."

For now, track and field's world governing body collects blood samples on site and transports them to laboratories outside the country. Anti-Doping Norway, an independent agency, recently collected urine and blood samples on behalf of the IAAF in Kenya, and the organization and China's Anti-Doping Agency are assisting Kenya in developing the country's newly created antidoping body.

The IAAF has been pushing hard for a facility in Kenya that would meet with World Anti-Doping Agency approval and provide blood analysis. "Due to complications on the part of the local partner in Kenya, the facility is not yet in place, and we are not in position to provide a new approximate date," said Chris Turner, an IAAF spokesman, who emphasized that "having the local facility in place would assist the IAAF but it in no way means that samples are not being collected in Kenya."

Many Kenyans might prefer to watch soccer, but their runners, both on the track and on the road, have been some of the country's most visible international ambassadors through the years: from Kip Keino, now chairman of Kenya's Olympic Committee, to Paul Tergat to David Rudisha.

It is a rich legacy, one well worth protecting and extending, but only

without the unnatural advantages.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

30 years ago: 26 August 1985

Five months after winning the first of her two world cross-country titles in Lisbon, and nine days after her victory in the European Cup 3000 metres in Moscow, Zola Budd came up against the world record holder in the 5000 m, Ingrid Kristiansen, in London. It was a race designed for the Norwegian to make an attempt at her record (14:58.89), but it was Budd who reeled off kilometres of 2:53.7, 2:55.3, 3:01.5, 2:58.2 and 2:59.4 to smash the 14-month-old mark with her 14:48.07. Kristiansen (14:57.43) also bettered her previous time, with Lorraine Moller (NZL) almost a minute behind the winner in 15:35.75. Budd had run 15:01.83 in Stellenbosch the previous year, but this was never recognised by the IAAF as a world record because South Africa was still suspended by the world body.
