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#### **EDITORIAL**

Two 15 km races that have both been run more than 30 times were held this past weekend. In Constantia, Cape Town, the Fry's Hohenort had its 43<sup>rd</sup> edition, with the wins going to Mthandazo Qhina in 48:40 and Fortunate Chidzivo (ZIM) in 56:58. It was the second victory in less than a week for Chidzivo; she had also won the NutriBullet 30 km the previous Sunday (results included this week). In Port Elizabeth the 32<sup>nd</sup> N2 City Bluewater Bay race was won by Zolani Mabhongo in 47:55 and Siphokazi Nojoko in 62:10.

Not counting the aided Bay to Bay course, the Port Elizabeth race produced eight list leaders and the much more difficult event in Constantia three.

The finishers figure for the Tokai Manor House Run in last week's DRR was wrong – the first three digits (814) was the correct figure. The last three (805) represented the 2015 figure, which was not deleted by mistake.

Because of the late publication of our US partner *Race Results Weekly* today, we will catch up with the international results next week.

#### **ELROY GELANT ON HIS WAY TO TRAIN WITH THE KENYANS**

Distance runner Elroy Gelant will spend a month training with some of the world's best athletes, with support from Athletics South Africa (ASA), as he attempts to close the gap on the dominant East African stars.

"The aim for the training camp is not only the high altitude but for Elroy to be able to train with the best in the business," said Aleck Skhosana, President of ASA.

A former World Student Games bronze medallist, Gelant took a big step forward in his career in 2013 when he reached the 5000 m final at the IAAF World Championships in Moscow and finished 20th in the senior men's 12 km race at the IAAF World Cross-country Championships in Bydgoszcz, and the following year he was seventh in the 3000 m at the IAAF World Indoor Championships in Sopot and 13th at the World Half-marathon Championships in Copenhagen.

He enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2016, however, with a string of impressive performances. The 30-year-old athlete shattered Stephen Mokoka's national 5000 m record, clocking 13:04.88 in Hengelo, and he went on to earn the silver medal in his specialist track event at the African Championships in Durban, before finishing 13th in the final at the Rio Olympics.

"Our athletes can only gain from such training camps, in order to bring back our former glory in middle and long distance events," Skhosana said. "This should help his buildup to London in March for the World Champs. ASA will be looking to send more middle and long distance athletes to such training camps in future, as part of the federation's long-term preparation towards the 2020 Tokyo Olympics."

## KIMETTO, KIPLAGAT LEAD BOSTON MARATHON ELITE FIELDS

Forty-four elite runners representing ten different nations will compete in the 121st Boston Marathon on Monday, 17 April, led by world record holder Dennis Kimetto and two-time world champion Edna Kiplagat, reports David Monti for *Race Results Weekly*. These elite athletes will be competing for a \$150 000 first prize, and the race will be the finale of the Abbott World Marathon Majors Series X.

Kimetto, 32, set the still-standing marathon world record of 2:02:57 at the BMW Berlin Marathon in September 2014. Since then, the Kenyan has struggled to remain at the top of the sport. During his 2015 and 2016 campaigns, he started four marathons and failed to finish two, including the 2015 IAAF World Championships in Beijing. His best mark during that period was a 2:05:50, good for third place at the 2015 Virgin Money London Marathon.

Kiplagat, 37, won back-to-back world marathon titles in Daegu in 2011 and then in Moscow in 2013. Since then she has run six marathons, scoring podium finishes in three and taking the win at the Virgin Money London Marathon in 2014. Her most recent result was a second place finish at the Bank of America Chicago Marathon last October in 2:23:28. She has five career marathon wins, including the 2010 TCS New York City Marathon.

The men's field has seven more Kenyan men, including the 2011 London champion Emmanuel Mutai (2:03:13 personal best), former world record holder Patrick Makau (2:03:38), 2010 world half-marathon championships bronze medallist Sammy Kitwara (2:04:28), three-time TCS Amsterdam Marathon champion Wilson Chebet (2:05:27) and 2012 Boston Marathon champion Wesley Korir (2:06:13).

There is also a quartet of strong Ethiopian athletes in the men's field led by defending champion Lemi Berhanu Hayle (2:04:33). The others are Yemane Tsegay (2:04:48), Dino Sefir (2:04:50), and Sisay Lemma (2:05:16).

The entire 2016 USA men's Olympic Marathon team -- Meb Keflezighi (2:08:37), Galen Rupp (2:10:05) and Jared Ward (2:11:30) -- are also competing. Rupp, who has run only two marathons, was the Rio Olympic bronze medallist.

In the women's contest, Kiplagat's key challengers should be Kenya's Gladys Cherono (2:19:25 PB), the 2014 world half-marathon champion and 2015 BMW Berlin Marathon winner; Ethiopia's Atsede Baysa (2:22:03), the reigning Boston champion; Shalane Flanagan (2:21:14), the second-fastest American woman of all-time; and Des Linden (2:22:38), who nearly won the Boston Marathon in 2011 when she finished second just two seconds behind the winner.

# GERT ENGELBRECHT, RESPECTED ADMINISTRATOR AND COACH, PASSES AWAY

South African athletics lost one of its most experienced and respected administrators and coaches with the death after a long illness of Gert Engelbrecht on Monday, 9 January. Engelbrecht, who was 71, passed away in the hospital in Mossel Bay, where he and wife Elize were on holiday.

Engelbrecht's most outstanding achievement in athletics administration is probably his tenure as Chairman of the track section of Bellville Athletics Club, which lasted from 1982 until his death. Very few club chairmen in South Africa, if any, can point to such a long service to the sport.

Engelbrecht also served as representative of Bellville AC on the provincial body, Western Province Athletics (WPA), from 1982 to 1993. He was a member of the WPA Track and Field Commission from 1982 to 2007 and treasurer of the Commission from 1993 to 2007.

He started coaching, specifically the hammer throw, in 1994 and was an IAAF Level 2 coach since 1998. Athletes coached by him won 23 medals at SA Championships and represented South Africa at the World Junior Championships, CAA All Africa Championships and the Southern Region Student Games.

Engelbrecht was manager of WP senior and junior teams from 1997 to 2014 and was a member of the local organising committee of the World Cross-country Championships which were held in Stellenbosch in 1996. He qualified as a timekeeper and field events official in 1989 and later became a referee in both disciplines. He was also a qualified equipment assizer and trained officials in the skills of assizing.

He joined the Committee of the Bellville Sport Federation (BSF), which was formed to assist all sports clubs in Cape Town's northern suburbs, in 1984 and became Vice-chairman six years later. The BSF changed its name to the Tygerberg Sport Board of Control (Bellville area) in 2000, and Engelbrecht served until 2006, when he became Chairman of the Forum of District 4 until 2013.

Engelbrecht, who played rugby for the False Bay Rugby Club in his younger days and represented Western Province in the hammer throw for several years, organised the first street mile in the province in 1986. It was run along Voortrekker Road from the Bellville Civic Centre to the old Bellville athletics track.

His daughter Marilize (later Coetzee) was coached by Engelbrecht and twice won the gold medal in the hammer throw at the SA u.23 Championships; she was WP senior champion on twenty occasions. She also won the title at the Southern Region Student Games in 1997 and was SA Students champion three times. She represented WP from 1995 to 2016.

Among the other athletes coached by him were Elmarie Knoetzen, who held the SA record until 2012 and won two SA titles; JD Wiggins, SA junior and WP junior and senior champion; Tiaan Naudé, WP junior and senior champion; Johan Kruger, who was WP junior champion and won silver and bronze medals at the SA Championships; Carissa van Beeck, WP champion; Gavin Shaw and Arno van der Westhuizen, both SA junior as well as WP junior and senior champions; and Eliska van der Merwe, WP junior champion.

Among his development activities, Engelbrecht found accommodation and jobs for Bobang Phiri and Esau Faro in Cape Town. Phiri represented the country at the Olympic Games when South Africa was reinstated in 1992 and at the Commonwealth Games two years later, while Faro represented Western Province in track, road and cross-country and is still actively involved in coaching junior athletes.

Engelbrecht was born in Langebaan on 24 February 1946 and moved to Cape Town in 1956, where he matriculated at Zwaanswyk High School in 1965. He studied to become a scientist at Karl Bremer and Groote Schuur hospitals and in 2007 became head of the Microsurgery Department at Tygerberg Medical School.

Engelbrecht leaves his wife Elize, also a well-known athlete, coach and administrator, daughter Marilize, son-in-law Fanie and two grandchildren, Mieke and Corné.

# 36 years ago: 25 January 1981

Mark Plaatjes, a 19-year-old Wits student, won the first edition of the Flight Hand Cleaner Marathon in Benoni by almost four minutes in 2:24:32. Among the well-known runners in his wake were Dave Wright, Riël Hugo, Bruce Fordyce (who was sixth), Jax Snyman, Ian Emery, Derick Marcisz and Dudley Hulbert, as well as 50-year-old Lars Naylor, who ran 2:57:18. The women's winner was Barbara Gilfillan in 3:20:22. Twelve years later in Stuttgart, Plaatjes would win the World Championships Marathon in the colours of the USA, clocking 2:13:57 to beat another African-born athlete, Lucketz Swartbooi (NAM). The Flight Hand Cleaner Marathon is now known as the Johnson Crane and has been held 36 times.
