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EDITORIAL

Compared to the high drama of the 2016 "down" Comrades, when women's race leader (by a long way) Caroline Wöstmann was struck down by cramps in the latter stages of the race -- and was hit by two motorcycles -- to be passed by Charné Bosman, the 2017 "up" race was, well, almost boring. Until 300 m from the finish, when race leader Camille Herron (who had been in front right from the gun) rounded the penultimate corner onto the grass of the Scottsville Racecourse, received the traditional baton with the mayoral message and rose -- and then stopped her watch and stopped running.

While millions of TV viewers were watching with their hearts in their throats, the American, former world champion over 50 km and 100 km, seemed wholly unconcerned and stood around chatting and giving high-fives to the spectators lining the run-in to the finish. An official rushed up to her and presumably told her that she had not crossed the line yet. But still Herron, 35, did not seem to comprehend and started to amble along the barrier.

It was only when a male runner came up to her from behind and pointed in the direction of the finish line and took her by the elbow that she started running again. She crossed the finish mat in 6:27:35 to claim victory by just more than four minutes over unheralded Russian Aleksandra Morozova. Herron is only the second US female winner of the Comrades after Ann Trason, who won in 1996 and 1997. Herron's only previous attempt at the Comrades, in 2014, resulted in her failing to finish because of illness.

There were four American women in the top ten, with Sarah Bard, who was fourth last year, finishing sixth, Colleen de Reuck (seventh in 2016) seventh again and Devon Yanko (fifth in 2012) tenth.

In third came the first South African, Bosman, who won the down run last year. A disappointed Bosman said later that she had a tough run from early on and considered pulling out more than once. The encouragement of the spectators carried her through, she said.

In the men's race the 2014 down run champion, Bongmusa Mthembu, made amends for his 2015 up run disappointment by winning rather easily in 5:35:34 from Zimbabwean Hatiwande Nyamande, who was third in the last up run. Mthembu's time was almost exactly three minutes faster than Gift Kelehe's 5:38:36 in 2015 (when the course was a kilometre longer). Kelehe finished third this time, in 5:41:48.

With the route being a kilometre shorter than in 2015, eighteen men dipped under six hours, compared to only ten two years ago. At 86.73 km, it was the shortest Comrades since 2002. On the other hand, in 2015 twenty-one women beat the silver medal cut-off of $7\frac{1}{2}$ hours; only fifteen did so this year.

The early pacemakers in the darkness as the runners charged away from in front of the Durban City Hall were Sootho Raletebele (LES) and Thobani Chagwe. It later turned out that they were setting the pace for clubmates Teboho Sello (LES) and Charles Tjiane. If that was the case, it seemed that no one had told Sello and Tjiane, for they were more than four minutes behind.

The twosome were still leading after 90 minutes of running, now seven minutes in front of the huge pack that contained all the main contenders. At 30 km Tjiane was in fourth, just under seven minutes behind Chagwe, who was now alone in front. At this stage last year's winner and record setter David Gatebe was almost eight minutes behind in the company of Mthembu (who had been only 44th at the first checkpoint, at 18 km), Mike Fokoroni (ZIM) and Kelehe.

Chagwe threw in the towel after just more than two hours of running and Raletebele took over, only to succumb on the second of the five big inclines of the up run, Botha's Hill. Doing TV commentary, Hendrick Ramaala drily commented: "I hope he learned his lesson."

Tjiane, running strongly, took the lead after 2 hours, 38 minutes of running and reached halfway at Drummond in 2:47:29. He was 1:38 ahead of three-times Two Oceans winner Marko Mambo (ZIM), who was followed in close order by Thabo Nkuna, Rufus Photo, Thulani Duma, Siphiwe Ndlela, Nkosinathi Duma, and a large group that included Melly Kennedy (KEN), Gatebe, Mthembu, Fokoroni, three-time champion Stephen Muzhingi (ZIM), Nyamande and Kelehe. The runners from second to 22nd were separated by only nine seconds.

At 56 km Tjiane was still in front, but behind him a menacing group of Mthembu, Ludwick Mamabolo (who was 23rd at halfway), Gatebe, Nyamande, Kelehe and Sello were gathering themselves for the pursuit. Kennedy was now tenth, Fokoroni twelfth, while Mambo had dropped back to fifteenth.

With the clock showing 4:05, Sello fell behind. Five minutes later Tjiane, who won the Loskop 50 km earlier this year, took a short walk. He was clearly struggling, and less than a minute later Kelehe, Mthembu and Nyamande charged by. They had shaken off Gatebe and 2012 champion Mamabolo.

Now the race was really on. The contrast between the three men were striking: Nyamande is tall with widely swinging arms, Mthembu is not as tall, but is built like a rugby forward with huge thighs, while Kelehe is short and compact.

At 66 km they were still together, with Mamabolo now 33 seconds behind, Sello another 20 seconds further back, followed by Tjiane (1:40 behind the leaders) and Gatebe (2:41 behind). Kelehe's attempt to defend his title ended at 4:22 when a small gap appeared between him and his adversaries. A cat-and-mouse game then followed as Mthembu and Nyamande each tried more than once to shake the other. On Little Polly's (the precursor to the last major hill, the dreaded Polly Shortts), Mthembu delivered the knockout punch and powered away. The Zimbabwean had no answer.

Mthembu, who last year had finished second in the IAU World 100 km Championships -- beating Kelehe (9th) and Gatebe (12th) -- and broke Bruce Fordyce's 1989 SA record (which was then the world record) with his 6:24:05, reached 10 km to go in 4:57:07 and the top of Polly's, with 7.5 km to go, in 5:07:32. His strong climb up the hill had stretched his lead to 72 seconds.

Kelehe was 2:41 behind in third, with Mamabolo another 1:57 behind. The rest of the top ten were Sello, Tjiane, still holding on grimly, Ndlela, Prodigal Khumalo (ZIM), Briton Steven Way (who hadn't been in the top twenty an hour earlier) and Fritjof Fagerlund (SWE). The latter was 12:42 behind Mthembu.

Mthembu ran the next 6 km untroubled in 23:17 and the last 4 km in 15:10. He is the first South African since Fordyce to win the Comrades twice, albeit not consecutively (as Fordyce did in 1981-88 and again in 1990). He continued the tradition that no athlete who reached the top of Polly Shortts first has ever lost the race. The order of the top ten changed only slightly over the last few kilomeres, with Sello dropping back to seventh.

Five South Africans won gold medals, one more than in the last up run and three fewer than last year (when Gatebe, Mamabolo and Mthembu finished in the top three positions).

Mthembu, who hails from Pietermaritzburg, was met by his small son at the finish. "I had a good strategy and everything worked," he said. When asked about the feeling among experts that he was primarily a downhill runner and whether he felt he had proven them wrong (he failed to finish the 2013 up run and was 17th in 2015), he said: "No, the last two years were just a build-up for this." Referring to his son (he himself is one of eight children), he said: "This is the first time he has seen me on TV."

Another runner whose strategy worked was Herron. Reminiscent of the way her fellow countryman Alberto Salazar became the champion in 1994, she led from start to finish, although there were times when she seemed to be struggling. She came into the race having won the world titles over 50 km and 100 km in 2015, while last year she was third overall in the Ultra Race of Champions 100 km (with a course record) and fourth overall in the White River 50 Mile Trail Run.

With Wöstmann having withdrawn because of iunjury, Herron's ungainly style soon took her to a lead of more than four minutes over Jasmin Nunige (SUI) at 18 km, with South African favourite Bosman another 30 seconds back. Briton Carla Molinaro was fourth and Bard fifth. At 30 km Herron was almost seven minutes in front of Bosman, with the Swiss now third. The virtually unknown Morozova, who won the Logikom Marathon in Cyprus in 3:11:49 in March, was fourth, with De Reuck, 53, in fifth. Three more South Africans -- debutante Danette Smith, Stephanie Smith and Mary Khourie -- had moved into the top ten, with Yanko eleventh.

At halfway, which Herron passed in 3:07:23 (about three minutes faster than Wöstmann in 2015), her lead seemed insurmountable. She was 7:09 ahead of Nunige (who had passed Bosman after a brief battle seven minutes earlier) and 7:14 in front of the South African. Morozova was just another second behind, with De Reuck -- still, after 21 years, the SA marathon record holder -- another 1:48 back. Then followed Bard, the two Smiths, and a surprising Gerda Steyn. Khourie was still tenth, while Yanko had dropped back to fourteenth.

At Cato Ridge, after 57 km, the Russian had claimed second, but she was 6:44 behind the leader. Nunige and Bosman both seemed to be going through a bad patch and were respectively 8:15 and 8:24 behind Herron. Nine kilometres further, as Herron was slowing down, Morozova was still 6:06 behind. Stevn was now fifth and De Reuck seventh.

Herron was struggling and the long climb up Polly's took its toll, but she never walked -- although, at times, she looked on the verge of doing so. The earlier smile had turned into a grimace, her arms were flailing and her legs had stiffened considerably. But she did what all Comrades experts tell you to do up this last demanding uphill of the race: she kept moving forward, and she was determinedly hanging onto her hard-won lead. She reached

the top in 5:54:00 -- now 5:12 ahead of Morozova, who was 6:22 in front of Bosman. Steyn, who was 56th in the last up run and 14th last year, had moved into fourth.

Herron passed 6 km to go in 6:00:10. The next 4 km took her 17:45 and for the first time she looked in real trouble as she started swerving across the road and looked over her shoulder. She seemed somewhat disoriented -- much like Wöstmann had done last year -- and her lead was diminishing. Near the finish she still had to negotiate a steep descent into the tunnel underneath the racetrack, where one feared she would fall -- so awkward her stride appeared -- but she got through safely, climbed up the other side and then reached the final stretch of grass. The last two kilometres, including the stop when she tought she had finished, took 9:40.

Morozova finished in 6:31:45, with Bosman third in 6:39:51, more than six minutes slower than when she was second in 2015. There were only four South Africans in the top ten, with Steyn looking the freshest of any of the gold medalists in fourth.

Of her lapse near the finish, Herron said: "I thought I had finished; I was just enjoying the moment. But it was very, very hard." She said her participation in trail races had been good preparation for the gruelling Comrades. An emotional Herron added that it had been her dream to run the race since she was little and she called her win the biggest highlight of her career.

The first three runners in the 50-59 age group were exactly the same as last year: De Reuck, Tia Jones (AUS) and Jane Mudau.

Barry Holland, 65, and Louis Massyn, 66, both finished their 45th Comrades, in 10:54:02 and 10:59:36 respectively, to equal Dave Rogers' tally.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

(Almost exactly) 46 years ago: 6 June 1971

Frank Shorter's commanding 1972 Olympic marathon victory in his birthplace, Munich, is said to have started the running boom in the United States. He was the third US Olympic marathon champion, but -- although an accomplished track runner (he was fifth in the Munich 10000 m) -- his marathon career had an inauspicious start when he dropped out of the 1968 US trial race. On this day his second attempt went much better: he finished second to Kenny Moore in the AAU Championships in Eugene, running 2:17:44.6. This gave him a spot on the Pan American Games team, and two months later he won the title in Cali in 2:22:40. He also won his next five marathons, including the gold medal in Munich, and scored four consecutive wins in the Fukuoka Marathon. His last competitive marathon was in 1981 in Chicago, where he was third.
